Background

The Danebod Family Camps (pronounced *don'ah bo* or *dan'ah bo*) have met since 1948 under the leadership of the campers themselves. Each camper is encouraged to become involved in planning and implementing camp activities. The camps are governed by a board, which is composed of campers elected from each camp session, plus active permanent members.

Location

The Danebod Family Camps are held at the Danebod Folk School campus in the southwest Minnesota town of Tyler. Tyler is on US Highway 14, with the Danebod Folk School located one block south of US 14.

Beginning and Ending

Camp opens with supper Sunday evening and closes with breakfast Saturday morning. Plan to arrive early Sunday afternoon, in time to unpack and settle in.

Housing and Food

Housing is provided in the Folk School Dormitory, which is close to all activities. You may, if you choose, bring your own camper or tent which allows the camp to accommodate more people. All campers must bring their own bed linens, blankets, and towels. Upon request, older children may be assigned to room with other children of the same age and sex. All meals, which include some Danish specialties, are prepared by local cooks, and served in the lower level Dining Hall of the Dormitory building. Cost includes all meals, except for local campers who pay per meal.

Young Campers

Campers under college age must be accompanied by a parent or adult sponsor. Young people are the responsibility of their parents or sponsors at all times. Baby sitting is provided in the dormitory nightly from 8:00 p.m. to midnight. Parents of young children may wish to organize cooperative baby sitting at other times.

Limitations

No pets are permitted at camp. The Folk School Dormitory is a SMOKE-FREE building. Dormitory rooms are on second and third floors; access is by stairs only. The Dining and Lecture halls are wheel-chair accessible by ramp. Only the Dining Hall and Office areas are air conditioned.

Register by Mail

Space at Danebod Family Camp is limited. To reserve a spot in the camp of your choice, mail in your registration application as soon as possible. Registration applications are accepted on a first come, first served basis. With your application, you must include a \$40 deposit per person, with the exception of resource people. You will pay the balance when you arrive at Danebod. Your canceled check is your registration confirmation. Shortly before camp, you will receive a letter from your camp director. Note: all campers must register by mail—including resource people—to ensure room-and-board for everyone.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available to help defray costs. For more information, contact the director of your desired camp session.

Refund Policy

Refunds of the registration/deposit fee will be made if notice of cancellation is received at least 20 days prior to the first day of camp. Please contact the camp director if you need to cancel your registration.
